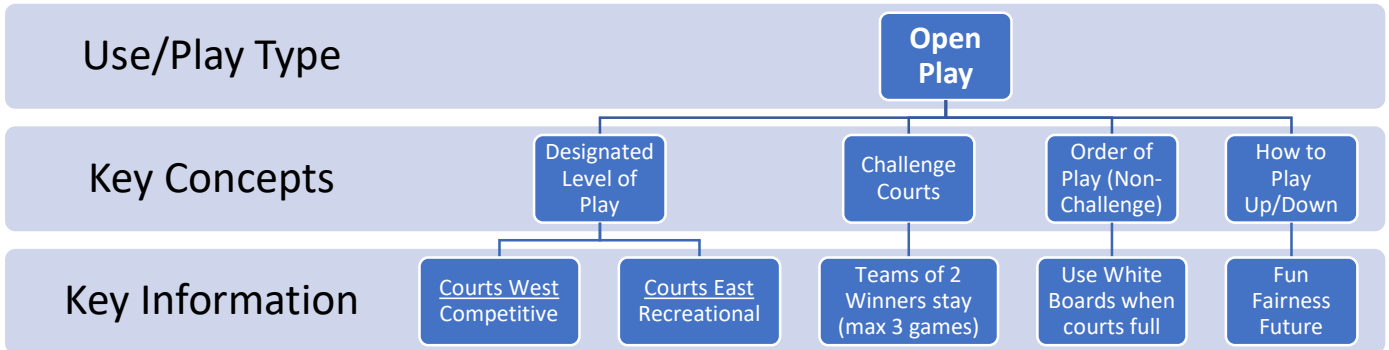




# CENTENNIAL PARK PICKLEBALL COURTS

## OPEN PLAY – KEY CONCEPTS & INFORMATION



<b>Use/Play Type: Open Play</b>	If court is empty and no players waiting, any skill level may play on open courts. If players are waiting, players must yield court at end of current game. (Exception: Challenge Courts)
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<u><b>Key Concepts</b></u>	<u><b>Key Information</b></u>
<b>Designated Level of Play</b>	Please refer to separate bulletins for complete information.  Open Play is generally most rewarding when all four players have similar skill levels. At Centennial Park Pickleball Courts, we <i>informally</i> split play between more Competitive players on the west side and Recreational players on the east. Player migration is self-regulated/organic based on Skill Level ratings or other relevant criteria.
<b>Challenge Courts</b>	In order to provide enhanced competitive opportunities, we have designated multiple Challenge Courts: Teams of 2, Winners stay on (max 3 games when 2 or more players are waiting), revert to Open Play when no challenges pending.
<b>Order of Play – Non-Challenge Courts</b>	When Non-Challenge courts are full, we use a whiteboard system to manage who gets the next available court.
<b>How to Play Up/Down</b>	At Centennial Park Courts, our goal is to foster an environment that enables quality play and improvement opportunities for all, including the shared experiences and learning that occurs through playing at different skill levels. As we each have a responsibility to participate in that process to our own abilities, please take some time to understand and put into practice these tips to help you be successful.
